Changes to boat storage and racking spaces 2019

- With increasing demand for the limited amount of available racking, as from the 1st January 2019 only fully paid up members will be permitted a racking space to store up to a maximum of two boats which are used on a regular basis. These may consist of either two K1s or a K1 and a K2. Racing Canadian canoes are also permissible.
- No member will be allowed racking space inside the boathouse solely for the purpose of boat storage: boats must be used on a regular basis throughout the season.
- Racking that is designed to hold two boats will be allocated to members that pay for two racks.
- For the purposes of the rules high up racking will be considered equal to lower level racking.
- Club equipment will be afforded adequate racking space appropriate to its users and their ability to access equipment.
- There will be no preferential allocation of racking spaces unless your boat is being used on a regular basis of at least once a week, on the river or canal. This will be at the discretion of the boat storage manager. Since space is limited and generally surf skis are not usually used on the river, we discourage storage at the club, in line with the principle that racking is not solely for boat storage. Members who have not renewed their membership by the 31st January will be asked to remove their boats. Failure to have paid membership renewal and the fee for racking space applied for and granted will mean that your canoe will be removed from the boathouse and placed on the grass in the secure compound, ready for collection.
- Temporary storage of a boat for a visiting canoeist will be at the discretion of the boat storage manager and the Commodore.
- Kayak storage fees per year from 1st Jan to 31st Dec: 1st boat £25, 2nd boat £35.
- All touring Canadian canoes will be stored outside, for a fee of £25.
- Temporary boat storage fee £10 per month, paid as a donation to the club.
- Boats must have a number disk attached in order to identify the owner.
- If a boat owner cannot be identified, or permission has not been granted for boat racking, the boat will be removed from the boathouse and placed on the grass in the secure compound. Reasonable attempts will be made to identify/contact the owner, but the club reserves the right to dispose of such boats.
